

Barry Gerson is an artist-filmmaker who has made films, sculptures, photographic constructions, digital film installations, and mixed painting/photo works. He has had solo shows at the Whitney Museum of American Art, Guggenheim Museum, and the Museum of Modern Art in New York. Jonas Mekas wrote about him (The Village Voice, 1973): "...His content is magic... it deals with the essence of cinema (the relation between seeing, image, and screen)... Every aspect of his images has been controlled, thought out, felt out".
